## WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS OBSERVED A VEHICLE DRIVING WITHOUT HEADLIGHTS AND SWERVING IN THE 1900 bLK OF W. MAIN DURING THE EARLY MORNING hours of 4/7. THE VEHICLE REFUSED TO STOP FOR THE OFFICER AND instead increased their speed. the vehicle started to turn onto NORTH BOUND I-35, THE OFFICER ATTEMPED A TACTICAL VEHICLE INTERVENTION (TVI) DUE TO THE ONGOING THREAT TO OTHER MOTORISTS. the Vehicle was disabled. the driver was arrested for eluding, driving under the influence, and transporting an open container OF ALCOHOL.
AN OFFICER CONDUCTING A TRAFFIC STOP ON 4/9 DETECTED THE SMELL OF marijuana coming from the vehicle. the driver admitted to having marijuana in the vehicle, but left the stop in his vehicle before the conclusion of the traffic contact. the vehicle was found ABANDONED IN THE ROADWAY, BUT OFFICERS WERE UNABLE TO LOCATE THE DRIVER. DURING THE VEHICLE INVENTORY, OFFICERS LOCATED OVER 78 LBS OF MARIJUANA AND OVER 2 LBS OF MUSHROOMS. THE INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING
ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 17 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 16 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 47 ANIMALS AND HAVE 148 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 34 OF THOSE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
