

A PROCLAMATION BY THE CITY MANAGER OF THE CITY OF NORMAN
DECLARING A CONCLUSION OF A WATER SHORTAGE EMERGENCY DUE TO
REDUCTION IN THE LONG TERM SOURCE OF SUPPLY FROM LAKE
THUNDERBIRD AND THE LONG TERM SOURCE OF SUPPLY FROM OKLAHOMA
CITY AS OF July 17, 2022

WHEREAS, the Norman City Council adopted Resolution R-2122-70 on December 14, 2021 adopting the City of Norman Water Conservation Plan 2021 which includes the Drought Contingency Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Water Conservation Plan allows for different conservation measures to be implemented based on differing water demand and supply conditions; and

WHEREAS, Severe (Mandatory) Conservation Measures may be implemented by the City Manager when there is a reduction in the long term source of supply from Lake Thunderbird and or Oklahoma City and there is no weather related relief in the immediate forecast; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2022, the City Manager signed a proclamation declaring of Severe (Mandatory) Conservation modeled after Stage 3 of the City of Norman Water Conservation Plan, due to the demand and weather conditions; and

WHEREAS, disruptions to Oklahoma City water supply have been remedied and all repairs have been made to the Central Oklahoma Master Conservancy pump station resulting in the City water demand no longer exceeding the NUA's supply capacity by greater than 3 MGD on consecutive days; and

NOW THEREFORE, the City Manager of the City of Norman hereby proclaims:

- § 1. THAT, a water shortage emergency no longer exists; and
- § 2. THAT, Severe (Mandatory) Conservation measures are hereby rescinded.
