STABBING. INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT THE SUSPECT FORCED THEIR WAY into the victim's apartment and stabbed them before fleeing the area. the VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED tO AN AREA HOSPITAL WITH MUTIPLE STAB WOUNDS. THE incident remains under investigation.
OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A bUSINESS IN THE 1000 blk OF ALAMEDA ST ON 6/21 FOR SUSPECT WITH A PISTOL CHASING ANOTHER PERSON. OFFICERS CONTACTED THE VICtim who was closing the business, and the suspect refused to leave. the suspect threatened to kill him and pointed a firearm at him. the victim ran and the suspect eventually fled the area. officers were able to IDENTIFY THE SUSPECT AND A WARRANT WAS REQUESTED.

- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 37 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 8 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 79 ANIMALS AND HAVE 174 animals in their care. 40 OF those animals are in placement with fosters a graduation ceremony was held last week for the annual junior police academy. this year, 20 Students between the ages of 12-15 Years old attended the course, which provided education on police practices, POLICIES, AND PROCEDURES.
