- the npd proactive crime enforcement unit (pace) has initiated a bait bike PROJECT TO HELP ADDRESS THE ONGOING PROBLEM OF BIKE THEFT IN NORMAN. multiple bicycles equipped with tracking devices have been deployed across norman over the course of the last month. the bicycles have been stolen multiple times and are most often taken within 48 hours of placement at a location. to date, the bait bike project has resulted in six ARRESTS ON VARIOUS COMPLAINTS INCLUDING KNOWINGLY CONCEALING STOLEN PROPERTY, PETIT LARCENY, WARRANTS, AND OBSTRUCTION. RESIDENTS ARE reminded to take the proper precautions and lock up their bikes to PREVENT THEFT.
