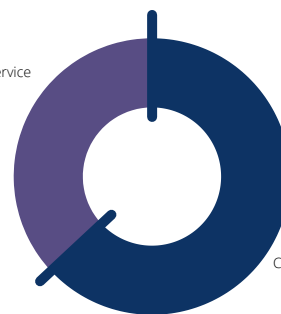

WEEK IN REVIEW

- NPd RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION INVOLVING TWO VEHICLES AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROCK CREEK ROAD AND 60TH AVENUE NW ON 07/28. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT A TRUCK WAS TRAVELING ON ROCK CREEK RD AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED AND DID NOT STOP FOR THE STOP SIGN AND COLLIDED WITH AN SUV. THE SUV WAS OCCUPIED BY FOUR INDIVIDUALS - 1 OCCUPANT DIED AS A RESULT OF INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE COLLISION AND 3 OTHERS WERE TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL IN SERIOUS CONDITION. THE DRIVER OF THE TRUCK FLED THE SCENE, BUT WAS LATER ARRESTED. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY CIRT.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE 1600 BLK CARIBOU CT ON 08/02 REGARDING A DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE. THE SUSPECT ASSAULTED HIS EX-WIFE AND STOLE PROPERTY BEFORE BARRICADING HIMSELF INSIDE THE RESIDENCE. RESPONDING OFFICERS MADE CONTACT AND ATTEMPTED TO NEGOTIATE HIS SURRENDER. SWAT WAS ACTIVATED AND MADE ENTRY. THE SUSPECT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 42 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 6 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. THEY ALSO TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 64 ANIMALS AND CURRENTLY HAVE 245 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE - 61 OF THOSE ARE CURRENTLY PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
- OFFICERS WITH THE PACE SECTION CONDUCTED MULTIPLE BAIT BIKE PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE CITY. THE PURPOSE OF THESE PROJECTS IS TO ADDRESS AND CURTAIL THE AMOUNT OF BICYCLE THEFTS THAT OCCUR WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY. DURING THE SECTION'S OPERATIONS WITHIN THE PAST WEEK, TWO INDIVIDUALS WERE ARRESTED FOR BICYCLE THEFT.
