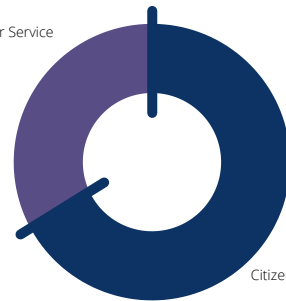

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS INITIATED A TRAFFIC STOP OF A VEHICLE BELIEVED TO BE CONNECTED TO A STRING OF VEHICLE BREAK-INS IN THE AREA OF 24TH AVE NW ON 8/5. DURING THE CONTACT, OFFICERS LOCATED A STOLEN FIREARM AND OTHER STOLEN PROPERTY. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION AND ADDITIONAL CRIMINAL CHARGES ARE ANTICIPATED.
- OFFICERS AND FIREFIGHTERS RESPONDED TO A SUSPICIOUS ODOR IN THE 1100 BLK OF SPARROW HAWK DR ON 8/7. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION FOUND A CONTAINER IN THE BACKYARD OF A RESIDENCE THAT HAD CHEMISTRY EQUIPMENT, UNKNOWN LIQUIDS AND A STRONG NOXIOUS ODOR. MEMBERS OF HAZARDOUS DEVICES UNIT AND NFD HAZMAT RESPONDED AND DETERMINED THE CHEMICALS WERE NOT IMMEDIATELY LIFE-THREATENING. FURTHER INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT A STUDENT HAD CONDUCTED AN EXPERIMENT TO PRODUCE THE ODOR AND THE STUDENT PLACED THE ITEMS IN THE BACKYARD. THE STUDENT AGREED TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF THE ITEMS.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN ASSAULT IN THE 1200 BLOCK OF NEWBURY DRIVE ON 8/10. THE VICTIM REPORTED WAKING UP TO TWO UNKNOWN MALES HITTING HIM WITH A HAMMER AND KNIFE. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL WITH NON-LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES. THE INVESTIGATION INTO THE INCIDENT IS ONGOING.
- THE 67TH POLICE ACADEMY BEGAN ON 8/9. THIS ACADEMY INCLUDES SIX CADETS WHO ARE SCHEDULED TO GRADUATE IN EARLY 2025.
- ANIMAL WELFARE PARTNERED WITH DOG IS MY COPILOT ON 08/07 AND SENT 49 ANIMALS ON A FLIGHT TO RESCUE ORGANIZATIONS IN COLORADO AND OREGON.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 30 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 54 TRANSFERRED TO RESCUES, AND 10 RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 63 ANIMALS. CURRENTLY, THEY HAVE 202 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 69 IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
