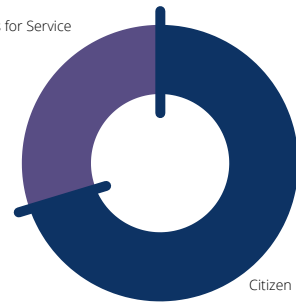

WEEK IN REVIEW

- THE NPD HAZARDOUS DEVICES UNIT (HDU) RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF MILITARY AMMUNITION IN THE FRONT YARD OF A RESIDENCE IN THE 200 BLK OF S. FLOOD AVE ON 9/22. EXAMINATION OF THE ITEM DETERMINED IT TO BE A MILITARY TRAINING ROUND. HDU TECHNICIANS COORDINATED WITH NEARBY MILITARY PERSONNEL FOR PROPER REMOVAL AND RETURN OF THE AMMUNITION.
- NPD ARRESTED TWO INDIVIDUALS IN CONNECTION TO THE FATAL HIT AND RUN COLLISION THAT OCCURRED IN THE 1400 BLOCK OF 12TH AVE SE ON 9/19. ON 9/26, OFFICERS ARRESTED THE DRIVER ON A CHARGE OF LEAVING THE SCENE OF A FATALITY COLLISION AND THE PASSENGER ON A CHARGE OF CONSPIRING TO COMMIT A FELONY CRIME. BOTH WERE BOOKED INTO CCDC. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORTED STABBING IN THE 100 BLK OF N. PETERS AVE ON 9/27. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THEY CONTACTED 2 JUVENILES AND AN ADULT. ONE JUVENILE HAD A STAB WOUND TO THEIR HAND AND THIGH. OFFICERS DETAINED THE ADULT AND RENDERED AID TO THE INJURED VICTIM. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT THE TWO JUVENILES WERE ATTEMPTING TO RUN AWAY FROM THE SUSPECT WHEN HE ATTACKED ONE OF THE VICTIMS WITH A KNIFE. THE INJURED VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL AND THE ADULT WAS ARRESTED AND BOOKED INTO CCDC FOR ASSAULT WITH A DANGEROUS WEAPON.
- THE TRAINING SECTION OF THE DEPARTMENT WAS AWARDED THE STATE'S VINE AWARD FOR OUR EFFORTS IN TRAINING OFFICERS TO EFFECTIVELY AND COMPASSIONATELY RESPOND TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INCIDENTS.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 41 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 5 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK 78 ANIMALS INTO THE SHELTER THIS WEEK. THEY CURRENTLY HAVE 184 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 64 OF THOSE ANIMALS IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
