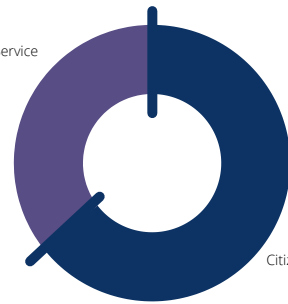

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN ARMED ROBBERY THAT OCCURRED NEAR WHITE AND BUCHANAN AVE ON 9/29. A DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE SUSPECT WAS PROVIDED. OFFICERS LATER RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SUSPICIOUS VEHICLE IN THE 400 BLK OF GEORGE L. CROSS DR. THE DRIVER, WHO WAS ASLEEP IN THE VEHICLE, MATCHED THE ROBBERY SUSPECT DESCRIPTION. UPON CONTACT, THE SUSPECT ATTEMPTED TO RUN WHEN OFFICERS ASKED ABOUT WEAPONS. THE SUSPECT DROPPED A LOADED HANDGUN BEFORE BEING CAUGHT BY OFFICERS. THE SUSPECT HAD A LOADED PISTOL MAGAZINE AS WELL AS THE ITEMS STOLEN DURING THE ROBBERY. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED ON COMPLAINTS OF DUI/APC, POSSESSION OF A FIREARM WHILE COMMITTING A FELONY, OBSTRUCTION, AND ROBBERY.
- THE NORMAN POLICE DEPARTMENT HOSTED THE 2024 NATIONAL NIGHT OUT EVENT AT SOONER MALL ON 9/30. THIS ANNUAL COMMUNITY-BUILDING CAMPAIGN PROMOTES POLICE AND COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS AND WAS ATTENDED BY NUMEROUS LOCAL PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCIES, LOCAL BUSINESSES, AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH ENTITIES. THE EVENT WAS A SUCCESS AND BROUGHT HUNDREDS OF COMMUNITY MEMBERS TOGETHER FOR THE EVENING.
- ON 10/1 ANIMAL WELFARE OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF MULTIPLE ANIMALS LIVING IN DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS IN THE 1800 BLOCK OF SOUTHCREST DR. OFFICERS MADE CONTACT WITH THE OWNER AND FOUND OVER 50 ANIMALS LIVING IN UNFIT CONDITIONS. THE ANIMALS WERE SEIZED, TREATED BY VETERINARY STAFF, AND ULTIMATELY TRANSFERRED TO A RESCUE. THE INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- P.A.C.E. CONDUCTED NUMEROUS PROJECTS THROUGH THE WEEK WHERE OFFICERS FOCUSED ON BUSINESSES SELLING TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO UNDER AGE INDIVIDUALS. DURING THE PROJECTS, 3 BUSINESSES ILLEGALLY SOLD TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND WERE CITED.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 37 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 60 TRANSFERRED TO RESCUE, AND 9 RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 162 ANIMALS AND CURRENTLY HAVE 212 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 59 IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
