### **WEEK IN REVIEW**

- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORTED BURGLARY IN THE 1600 BLOCK OF GLENN BO DR ON 10/14. THE CALLER REPORTED AN UNKNOWN SUBJECT WAS FOUND INSIDE OF THEIR HOME. A JUVENILE RESIDENT CONFRONTED THE SUBJECT WHO HIT THE JUVENILE AND RAN FROM THE HOME. OFFICERS SEARCHED THE AREA BUT DID NOT LOCATE THE SUBJECT. THE SCENE WAS PROCESSED AND THE INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORTED CARJACKING IN THE 900 BLK OF SW 24TH AVE ON 10/14. THE VICTIM, WHO SHOWED SIGNS OF IMPAIRMENT, REPORTED THAT 2 UNKNOWN SUBJECTS ASSAULTED HIM AND THEN STOLE HIS CELL PHONE AND VEHICLE. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED AN HOUR BEFORE THE VICTIM CALLED AND NO SUSPECT INFORMATION WAS GIVEN. THE INVESTIGATION INTO THE INCIDENT IS ONGOING.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SUICIDAL SUBJECT WITH A GUN IN THE 100 BLK OF W. HAYES ST ON 10/14. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THE SUBJECT FIRED A SHOT IN THEIR BACKYARD AND THEN RETREATED INTO THEIR HOME. OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO QUICKLY ESTABLISH COMMUNICATION WITH THE SUBJECT AND TALK HIM INTO SURRENDERING. THE SUBJECT WAS TRANSPORTED FOR TREATMENT.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A STABBING IN THE 200 BLOCK OF REED AVE ON 10/18. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED A VICTIM WITH A STAB WOUND TO THE ABDOMEN. INITIAL INFORMATION INDICATES THAT THE VICTIM WAS INVOLVED IN AN ALTERCATION WITH AN UNKNOWN SUBJECT WHO STABBED THEM AND THEN RAN FROM THE AREA. THE VICTIM WAS TRASNPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR NON-LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES. INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- THE COMMUNITY SERVICES SECTION HOSTED A COFFEE WITH A COP EVENT ON 10/17. CITIZENS INTERACTED WITH OFFICERS AND DISCUSSED THEIR CONCERNS OF WHAT IS GOING ON IN THE COMMUNITY.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 30 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 2 ANIMALS TRANSFERRED TO RESCUE. AND 9 RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 81 ANIMALS. NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 177 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 37 OF THOSE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
