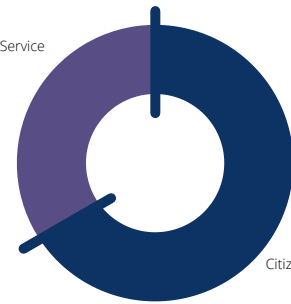

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SUSPICIOUS VEHICLE IN THE 3800 BLK OF LEWIS ST ON 10/22. THEY QUICKLY LOCATED THE VEHICLE AND CONTACTED THE DRIVER WHO PROVIDED IDENTIFICATION. A CHECK REVEALED A WARRANT FOR THE DRIVER. WHEN OFFICERS ADVISED THE DRIVER OF THE WARRANTS, THE DRIVER DROVE AWAY. OFFICERS FOLLOWED THE VEHICLE WITH LIGHTS AND SIRENS AT SPEEDS OF APPROXIMATELY 25 WHEN THE DRIVER STARTED TO DRIVE RECKLESSLY ALMOST CAUSING A COLLISION. SINCE OFFICERS HAD IDENTIFIED THE INDIVIDUAL, THEY DISENGAGED AND REQUESTED A WARRANT FOR THE INDIVIDUAL.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A SHOOTING IN THE 1600 BLK OF 24TH AVE SE ON 10/23. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS FOUND A JUVENILE VICTIM WITH A GUNSHOT WOUND. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT A JUVENILE SUSPECT WAS INVOLVED IN AN ALTERCATION WITH THE VICTIM. THE SUSPECT PRESENTED A FIREARM AND SHOT THE VICTIM BEFORE RUNNING FROM THE AREA. OFFICERS LOCATED THE SUSPECT WHO WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT INCIDENT. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WITH NON-LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES. THE INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- OFFICERS WERE CALLED TO A SHOOTING IN THE 400 BLK OF TOBERMAN DR ON 10/24. OFFICERS CONTACTED THE VICTIM WHO INDICATED THEY HAD BEEN SHOT BY AN UNKNOWN SUBJECT WHO HAD ATTEMPTED TO ROB THEM. THE INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE VICTIM HAD SHOT THEMSELVES IN PURCELL, AND THEN GOT A RIDE TO NORMAN. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL WITH NON-LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES.
- OFFICERS FROM THE COMMUNITY SERVICES SECTION PARTICIPATED IN THE DOWN WITH DRIVING TRAFFIC SAFETY EVENT WHICH WAS HOSTED BY THE DOWN SYNDROME ASSOCIATION OF CENTRAL OKLAHOMA. THIS EVENT WAS GEARED TOWARDS PROVIDING EDUCATION TO CITIZENS IN OUR REGION ON ROADWAY AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY.
- ANIMAL WELFARE PARTNERED WITH DOG IS MY COPILOT ON OCTOBER 23RD AND SENT 47 ANIMALS ON A FLIGHT TO A RESCUE ORGANIZATIONS IN COLORADO AND OREGON.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HOSTED MONSTER MIDNIGHT MUTTNESS AND KEPT THE SHELTER OPEN UNTIL MIDNIGHT FOR POTENTIAL ADOPTERS TO MEET THE ANIMALS. THIS EVENT RESULTED IN THE ADOPTION OF 3 DOGS AND GAVE THE PUBLIC WHO MAY NOT HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO VISIT THE SHELTER DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS A CHANCE TO SEE THE FACILITY. SEVERAL LOCAL VENDORS ALSO PARTICIPATED IN THE EVENT.
- ANIMAL WELFARE PARTNERED WITH CAVANDERS SUBARU FOR THE SUBARU LOVES PETS ADOPTION INITIATIVE AND NORMAN TWILIGHT MARKET FOR THE BOOS AND BARKS ADOPTION EVENT
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 29 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 47 ANIMALS TRANSFERRED TO RESCUE AND 13 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 40 ANIMALS. THEY CURRENTLY HAVE 120 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 45 OF THOSE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
