WEEK IN REVIEW

- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A COLLISION INVOLVING A SCHOOL BUS AT THE INTERSECTION OF 72ND AVE SE AND STATE HIGHWAY 9 (SH-9) ON 10/30. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT THE SCHOOL BUS WAS TRAVELING SOUTHBOUND ON 72ND AVE SE PREPARING TO CONTINUE SOUTH ACROSS SH-9 WHEN IT FAILED TO YIELD AND PULLED OUT IN FRONT OF A VEHICLE TRAVELING WESTBOUND ON SH-9. THE DRIVER OF THE SCHOOL BUS WAS CITED AT THE SCENE. THE TWO OCCUPANTS OF THE VEHICLE AND A JUVENILE OCCUPANT OF THE SCHOOL WERE TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL WITH MINOR, NON-LIFE-THREATENING
- OFFICERS ATTEMPTED A TRAFFIC STOP ON AN ERRACTIC DRIVER IN THE 500 BLOCK OF S. UNIVERSITY BLVD ON 11/1. DURING THE COURSE OF THE TRAFFIC STOP. THE DRIVER TOOK OFF AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED. THE OFFICER, SUSPECTING A DRUNK DRIVER, INITIATED A PURSUIT. AFTER TWO UNSUCCESSFUL TVI ATTEMPTS, THE DRIVER BAILED OUT WHILE THE CAR WAS STILL MOVING. AFTER A SHORT FOOT PURSUIT AND INVESTIGATION, THE JUVENILE DRIVER WAS ARRESTED FOR ELUDING A PEACE OFFICER, UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE, AND OTHER CHARGES. A JUVENILE PASSENGER WAS RELEASED TO THEIR PARENTS.
- CHIEF FOSTER PRESENTED THE CITY'S CORE VALUE AWARD TO JASON MCELHANEY ON 11/1 FOR HIS TIRELESS EFFORTS TO KEEP THE POLICE DEPARTMENT CLEAN. JASON'S EASY-GOING MANNER AND POSITIVE ATTITUDE WHEN HANDLING EVEN THE MOST DISGUSTING MESSES IS ESSENTIAL TO ENSURE THE BEST POSSIBLE SERVICE FOR THOSE THAT WORK AND VISIT.
- · ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 26 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 14 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 66 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 145 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 47 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
