

WEEK IN REVIEW

- SEVERE STORMS PASSED THROUGH NORMAN IN THE EARLY MORNING HOURS OF 11/3 BRINGING RAIN, HIGH WINDS, AS WELL AS TORNADO WATCHES AND WARNINGS. OFFICERS REMAINED AWARE THROUGHOUT THE STORMS AND OBSERVED NUMEROUS CITYWIDE LOCALIZED FLOODING AS WELL AS POWER FLASHES IN THE AREA OF ALAMEDA AND 24TH AVE SE. THE AREA WAS SURVEYED BY OFFICERS FOR DAMAGE. WHILE THERE WERE NUMEROUS DOWNED TREES AND DAMAGED POWER LINES, OFFICERS DID NOT LOCATE ANY STRUCTURE DAMAGE OR ENCOUNTER ANY INJURED PERSONS.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A BURGLARY IN THE 400 BLOCK OF DALTON RD ON 11/3. A VICTIM CONFRONTED THE SUSPECT IN THEIR GARAGE WHO TRIED TO HIDE BEFORE RUNNING AWAY. COMMUNICATIONS CONTINUED TO RECEIVE CALLS REPORTING THE SUSPECT WAS RUNNING THROUGH BACKYARDS AND TRYING TO GET INTO HOUSES. OFFICERS LOCATED THE SUSPECT AND TOOK HIM INTO TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE SUSPECT HAD ABANDONED A STOLEN VEHICLE IN THE AREA AND APPEARED TO BE SEVERELY IMPAIRED. THE SUSPECT WAS TREATED AT A LOCAL HOSPITAL BEFORE BEING BOOKED INTO CCDC.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A BURGLARY IN PROGRESS IN THE 100 BLOCK OF W. LINN ST AT APPROXIMATELY 12:51AM ON 11/6. THE REPORTING PARTY STATED THAT AN UNKNOWN INDIVIDUAL HAD ENTERED THEIR HOUSE THROUGH A BROKEN WINDOW. A SECOND INCIDENT CONNECTED INCIDENT WAS ALSO REPORTED IN THE 400 BLOCK OF S. SANTA FE AVE. OFFICERS LOCATED THE SUSPECT NEAR W. EUFAULA ST. AND S. SANTA FE AVE. HE WAS ARRESTED AND BOOKED INTO CCDC FOR FIRST DEGREE BURGLARY, PUBLIC INTOX, AND UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF PARAPHERNALIA.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A SINGLE VEHICLE COLLSION ON 11/8 IN THE 3000 BLK OF 24TH AVE NE. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION DETERMINED THAT A VEHICLE DRIVING NORTH ON 24TH UNEXPECTEDLY WENT LEFT OF CENTER AND DROVE OFF THE ROADWAY STRIKING A CONCRETE SIDE RAIL. THE DRIVER WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY C.I.R.T.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 23 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 8 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 53 ANIMALS AND HAVE 162 TOTAL ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE. 52 OF THOSE ANIMALS ARE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
