

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN ARMED ROBBERY IN THE 2800 BLOCK OF DEWEY AVE ON 11/10. THE VICTIMS STATED THEY WERE MEETING AN INDIVIDUAL TO SELL AN ITEM LISTED ON FACEBOOK MARKETPLACE WHEN THE SUSPECT CONFRONTED THEM, POINTED A FIREARM AT THEM, AND THEN TOOK THE ITEM. THE SUSPECT RAN FROM THE AREA. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INDIVIDUAL STRUCK BY A TRAIN ON 11/12. OFFICERS LOCATED THE INDIVIDUAL IN THE 1700 BLOCK OF CLASSEN BLVD. HE WAS CONSCIOUS AND REPORTED THAT HE HAD ATTEMPTED TO BEAT THE TRAIN AT THE LINDSEY STREET CROSSING WHEN HE WAS STUCK. HE WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. HIS INJURIES ARE BELIEVED TO BE NON-LIFE THREATENING.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN ARMED ROBBERY OF A BUSINESS IN THE 1200 BLOCK OF E. LINDSEY STREET ON 11/14. THE REPORTING PARTY SAID A SUSPECT ENTERED THE BUSINESS AND STOLE MERCHANDISE. A BUSINESS EMPLOYEE CONFRONTED THE SUSPECT WHO INITIATED A FIGHT, EVENTUALLY PULLING A FIREARM FROM HIS JACKET WHILE THREATENING TO KILL THE EMPLOYEE. THE SUSPECT THEN RAN FROM THE SCENE. OFFICERS ATTEMPTED TO LOCATE THE SUSPECT BUT WERE UNSUCCESSFUL. OFFICERS CONTACTED THE SUSPECT, WEARING THE SAME CLOTHING AS DURING THE ROBBERY, ON 11/15 NEAR CREEKSIDE AND LINDSEY. THE SUSPECT WAS UNCOOPERATIVE DURING INITIAL CONTACT BUT WAS ULTIMATELY ARRESTED. TWO LOADED HANDGUNS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE SUSPECT. THE INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 37 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 13 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR
 OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 53 ANIMALS INTO THE
 ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 142 ANIMALS IN
 THEIR CARE WITH 44 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
